The Air Force, anticipating passage of the military pay bill (Ed. note: President Eisenhower has already signed the bill which becomes effective 1 June 1958) has announced minimum requirements for FY 1959 selection master sergeants to be advanced to grade E-8.

To be eligible for consideration for E-8 promotion, airmen in grade E-7 must:

**Have 10 years active service as of September 1, 1958;

**Have two years in grade as of

the same date; and

**Successfully complete the USAF Supervisory Examination. PRT 28.

de corps. The "K" Staff doffs its hat to you "tigers".


