An article which recently appeared in the Hickam AFB Hawaiian Falcon described the daily labors of Staff Sergeant Albert K.Y. Chow. SSGT. Chow is assigned to the 154th Combat Support Squadron, Motor Vehicle Maintenance section, on drill status. In civilian life he treks across the base where he is employed by the 6486th Transportation Squadron. He, along with three other drivers, operate school buses for the handicapped and retarded children of military personnel based at Hickam AFB.

Some of the children, because of heir disability, must be carried by the driver from their home to the bus and then secured in their seats by safety belts. When they reach school, the driver carries them into the school as well.

Each bus is equipped with a two-way radio, special safety locks on the doors, seat belts for each passenger and extra seats which can enlarge the bus! capacity up to 13 children.
