The State Department of Defense, Hawaii Emergency Management Agency (DOD/HI-EMA) is requesting proposals for contractual support from a qualified team of planners, facilitators and writers to assist in the development of a new Hawaii Emergency Management Agency 5-year Strategic Plan, with a final plan approved by the Director of Emergency Management Agency.

Proposals may be submitted from the private (for profit and non-profit) sectors as well as religious and faith-based organizations, in accordance with Sec. 104, Public Law 104-193. All proposals must conform to the format and instructions provided in the **Request for Proposals (RFP) # CA-1815** information packets.
