The following are questions submitted prior to the due date of August 20, 2018.

- 1. Given references on Page 5, Section 2.1 of the RFP to current HI-EOP revisions, and aligning the deliverable(s) to that document, can you please speak to the progress of those revisions?
 - a. The EOP is being updated by HI-EMA and is due for its 2-year update. The plan update is ongoing.
- 2. Given that the RFP calls for a "CCTA Plan, annex, checklist," can you please speak more to the nature of the expected product(s)?
 - a. Based on what the counties required, we may be recommending a plan, a checklist, an annex the type of document is contingent on the county planning and their need.
- 3. Are you able to provide any information on budget preferences?

 a. We cannot identify our budget at this time. However, we are not looking for a 100 page plan.
- 4. On page 15 of the RFP, under the Evaluation Criteria, paragraph 4 states "Past Performance on Projects of Similar Scope for Public Agencies or Private Industry in Hawaii" will be worth 45 points. We understand that you are going to be considering the allocation of points for this element, but regardless appreciate the importance of local knowledge and experience to the execution of this project.

Our question is: Will the State recognize and award full points for past performance by a subcontractor member of a team? Specifically, while we have

personnel with past Hawaii experience we do not have corporate qualifications. If we have a teaming partner/subcontractor with such qualifications, could our proposal potentially receive the maximum possible points for this evaluation element?

- a. We want to ensure the consultant has some familiarity with Hawaii and the counties. We will consider if sub contractors experience.
- 5. What other activities (i.e., training, exercises, staffing, etc.) are being carried out and/or funded under the State's CCTA Grant?
 - a. The CCTA requires a gap assessment as one of the requirements. This year we have the Joint Counter Terrorism Awareness Workshop(JCTAWS). We requested a full-scale exercise for 2020 however, we have not yet received confirmation. We use the DHS Training Consortium to assist with training opportunities and will continue these opportunities in 2019.

 - b. Offeror Organization and Staffing (25)
 Experience of key personnel assigned to the project (including professional work experience in Hawaii and years of hands-on experience with emergency management planning and specialized planning expertise in the sync matrix planning, complex coordinated attack planning and emergency management. Evidence that at least one person tasked to the project maintains a secret clearance.
