The Disaster Assistance Branch (DAB) of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency is responsible for managing the Federal Emergency Management Agency’s (FEMA) Public Assistance Grant Program for the State of Hawaii. The DAB is responsible for working with FEMA as the applicants’ advocate to ensure applicants are compensated for eligible work; DAB is not staffed to handle the additional work that must be completed after a federal declaration is received.

Proposals may be submitted from the private (for profit and non-profit) sectors as well as religious and faith-based organizations, in accordance with Sec. 104, Public Law 104-193. All proposals must conform to the format and instructions provided in the Request for Proposals (RFP) CA-202405 packet.

Section 1: General Information

1.1 Purpose

The State of Hawai'i Department of Defense (DOD), Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency (HI-EMA), is the state's designated emergency management agency, charged with working with all levels of government, non-governmental organizations, and private sector to prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate against all hazards that threaten Hawai'i.

HIEMA was awarded a grant under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), an initiative funded by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program provides funding to state, local, tribal, and territorial governments to develop hazard mitigation plans and rebuild in a way that reduces, or mitigates, future disaster losses in their communities.

1.2 Background

The objective of this grant is to assess and analyze the hurricane and high-wind vulnerabilities of residential homes in the State of Hawai'i and to formulate mitigation strategies to protect residences from the impacts of tropical cyclones or other high-wind events.
