State pays homage to fallen warriors

Korean/Vietnam memorials dedication set for July 24

The Korean and Vietnam Memorials will be formally dedicated July 24 on the grounds of the State Capitol. The dedication is scheduled for 10 a.m.

A dedication committee, chaired by retired Brig. Gen. Irwin K. Cockett Jr., is spearheading the event along with the Department of Accounting and General Services and the State Department of Defense, under the direction of Maj. Gen. Edward V. Richardson, state adjutant general. Cockett is a veteran of both the Korean and Vietnam wars.

The theme of the dedication will be 'E

The Korean and Vietnam Memorials ho'i mai i ka aina,' which means 'returning ll be formally dedicated July 24 on the home.'

Governor John Waihee is scheduled to be the key note speaker. Music will be provided by the 111th Army Band, Hawaii National Guard. Military aircraft flyovers and a 21-gun salute are also being planned.

Completion of the memorials is expected by the end of June. The memorials are separate from each other but they are in close proximity and designed in the same style, with the name of each fallen service member engraved on a granite rock pedestal.

"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."



out the state, we cannot help but be alarmed at the lack of respect that so many of our fellow citizens display each and every time the pledge of allegiance, the playing of our national anthem or the passing of our colors occurs. Be it ignorance, disrespect, spite or just plain insensitivity, this is a disgrace to this symbol which has been the standard by which we enjoy the freedom and independence we so richly cherish.

Perhaps some have forgotten, perhaps some have never been taught, perhaps some just don't care. Whatever the reason, people need to be reminded and brought to realize that this is the flag that represents their country and all of the thousands of service members who made the supreme sacrifice for them. This is the flag which represents the future for their children and their children's children. This flag will be their continued source of freedom and independence.

As a brief refresher, when the national anthem is played, the pledge of allegiance is recited or the colors passed, all present should stand at attention and face the flag or music. Those in uniform should render a hand salute. Men not in uniform should remove any head dress and place their right hand over their heart. Women may also place their right hand over their heart or just stand at attention.

Let us, veterans, set the example so that others may properly honor this symbol of America's heritage and future.



DVA Chief visits Hawaii

Jesse Brown speaks with homeless vets

Mike Estelle, of Scottsdale, Ariz., came to Hawaii almost two years ago to train at the Hawaii Transportation School. When the business closed abruptly, he and about 200 other individuals were left homeless.

Estelle, a veteran who served with the U.S. Navy's Seabees until his medical discharge in 1966, is now numbered with the 250,000 homeless veterans that are living in the nation's streets, parks and in shelters.

Statistics reveal that one-third of about 900,000 homeless individuals in the country are veterans.

He is one of the many veterans whoDepartment of Veterans Affairs Secretary Jesse Brown has made top priority to help.

Brown spoke with a crowd of homeless veterans, some carrying their possessions in bags with rolled up sleeping pallets, and members of veterans organizations at a picnic at Kapiolani Park, May 21. Larry Lee, Office of Veterans Services director, attended the event with his staff to inform homeless veterans of available

state resources. The event was sponsored by the Brotherhood Rally of All Veterans Organizations (BRAVO).

Brown told the audience that homelessness is a tragedy. There are more homeless Vietnam veterans in America than were killed in the war, according to Brown.

In an effort to reassure the veterans that they have not been forgotten, Brown stressed that, since joining President Clinton's cabinet, he has increased funding to VA homeless programs to about \$70 million, held a national summit on veteran homelessness, and is working on opening four new VA Comprehensive Homeless Centers.

"We cannot attack the program of homelessness alone," Brown said, adding that his goal is to create a continuum of care for veterans.

If we all work together, I know we will be successful in ending this tragedy."

Unlike many veterans that find themselves in the unemployment line and on the streets, Estelle is remarkably optimistic. He is hoping to get a shot at having a new tool he designed and patented produced as a prototype. Having met BRAVO President John Rogers and other individuals, Estelle said he feels that attending the picnic was beneficial for him.

"Maybe God directed me here today, I don't know," he said.

The potluck picnic in the park is expected to become a quarterly event for BRAVO. Rogers is hoping that attendance will pick up and veterans organizations will see it as an opportunity to "put rank aside" and get to know each other.

Chosin Few honor Korea's unknown

A veteran's visit to the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific's (Punchbowl) Section U one year ago culminated in a moving tribute to America's unknown soldiers during a ceremony at the cemetery, May 22.

Visiting Hawaii from the mainland with a group of fellow members of the veterans' group, Chosin Few, in May 1993, retired sergeant Bob Holtzer was so affected by the row upon row of graves marked "U.S. Unknown -- Korea" that he set in motion efforts leading to the dedication of a plaque in honor of all Korea's unknown soldiers.

"I got up in the middle of the night and wrote a poem to the unknown. The next day, when I took my buddies to the cemetery ... I read the poem. One man fell to the ground in tears and said later it was as if a hand had reached down inside of him and squeezed his heart ... We vowed to give a proper tribute."

One year later, a plaque inscribed with Holtzer's poem was dedicated in a ceremony featuring Secretary for Veterans Affairs, Jesse Brown, who spoke of the "duty a nation faces when the

guns of war fall silent ... the duty of binding up the nation's wounds in the aftermath of war."

Retired Lt. Gen. Alpha Bowser also spoke at the ceremony, remembering the battle of the Chosin Reservoir, where 20,000 U.S., South Korean, British and Australian troops faced 120,000 Chinese forces in a brutal but heroic battle.

Following the formal ceremony, which also included a wreath laying and a booming 21-gun salute, the Honolulu Police Pipe band led veterans and guests in a procession to Section U, where flowers were laid on each of the 848 graves of Korea's unknown.

At the Punchbowl in Hawaii, Where banners for heroes are flown, There's a resting place, a plot of land, Marked: "Korea ... U.S. Unknown"

People pass by without a tear, it's sad "They're so all alone" For within this spot there are heroes; The souls of our unknown.

They rest here together nameless, Regardless of faith or race. Known only to God; "Yet" We veterans know their face!

Look around: you'll see them all battle, They died to tell our story, For without them we would not be here today! To bathe in all their "Glory"

They were there when we cried out yesterday, They helped to ease our pain, They rest here today so all alone, Not one of us recalls their names.

These men were all our buddies! They saved us many years ago, True, we may not recall the names, But their face ... "We'll always know."

We pray they are at peace today, within this "hallowed ground," For today without these nameless men, World Peace could not be found.

Clouds across the skies will shed their tears in many a foreign place, True! They're known only but to God. But we veterans know their face.

Forgive our lack of memory for names and the disregard we've shown, But forever and a day we'll see your face; "the face of our unknown." Bob Holtzer

Will the VA pay me an allowance if I have my spouse, who is a veteran, buried in a state-owned cemetery even if he was not receiving VA compensation or pension benefits at the time of his death?

No, but if your husband had qualifying service and he was buried free of charge in a section of a state-owned cemetery reserved solely for veterans, VA may be able to pay a \$150 plot allowance directly to the state.

If I am receiving Dependents Indemnity Compensation (DIC) monthly benefits and have them electronically deposited into my bank account, do I ever have to report my change of residence address to VA?

Yes. When VA needs to verify your marital status, they will need to correspond with you. If VA determines you have remarried or cannot locate you to update your marital status, your monthly benefit check may be suspended.

I'm the widow of a Persian Gulf War veteran who died from a service-connected disability. Am I eligible for his VA home loan entitlement?

You have entitlement in your own right as a surviving spouse who has not remarried.

The Vietnam Veterans of Hawaii Club is sponsoring a craft fair at the Diamond Head end of AlaMoana park, July 2nd and 3rd Saturday and Sunday. More than 150 crafters and artistians will be displaying items. The fair is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. both days.

Bonuses for veterans

West Virginia is looking for 22,000 active duty members or veterans of the state who may be eligible for cash bonuses for serving in the Persian Gulf, Panama, Grenada and Lebanon conflicts.

Qualifying service members, veterans or survivors could receive \$300 to \$1,000.

Members who deployed during the following periods are eligible for a \$500 bonus:

- Lebanon, Aug. 25, 1982 Feb. 26, 1984.
- •Grenada, Oct. 23, 1983 Nov. 21, 1983.
- •Panama, Dec. 12, 1989 Jan. 31, 1990.
- Persian Gulf, Aug. 2, 1990 April 11, 1991.

Surviving relatives of service members killed in combat in any of these operations are eligible for a \$1,000 payment. Bonuses are payable through June 30.

Akaka bill on Guard and Reserve benefits signed by President

President William J. Clinton signed a bill into law, May 4 that allows members of the National Guard and Reserves who have served at least 20 years and are eligible for retirement pay, to be buried in national cemeteries. The bill was introduced by U. S. Senator Daniel K. Akaka.

The bill will also allow spouses and dependents interment in the National Cemetery system.

Previously, only reservists who died during active duty service or who met the minimum criteria for "veteran" status (generally, 24-months of continuous active duty or duty during a period of war) were eligible.

Troops to Teachers program helps bridge the gap

The "Troops to Teachers" program provides up to \$5,000 in financial assistance to separated members of the armed forces and terminated civilian employees of the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) and Department of Energy (DOE) to obtain a teaching alternative certification or the necessary credentials to serve as a teacher's aide.

Eligible service members must have served on active duty for at least six continuous years immediately prior to an honorable discharge and apply not later that one year after separation. Eligible civilian employees of the DOD and DOE are those who have been terminated from government employment because of reductions in defense spending or the closure or realignment of a military installation. They must apply within 60 days of termination.

Applicants for employment as teachers must have at least a baccalaureate degree. Teacher's aides must have an associate degree. All applicants must, if selected, accept full-time employment for five years in a school which serves students from low-income families.

Army National Guard Title 10 and Title 32 Active Guard/Reserve (AGR) soldiers are eligible for this program. State military technicians (civilian) also may qualify.

American Legion offers walking tours at Punchbowl

A guided-tour of the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific is not only a stroll into history, but an opportunity to help fund numerous programs for veterans and their families.


During a news conference April 8, the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific (Punchbowl) Task Force announced the awarding of a contract to the American Legion to conduct guided-tours at the cemetery. The one-hour walking tours will be conducted by the Hawaii Educational Legion Program, a non-profit corporation formed by the Legion.

The walking tours are a result of the task force's two-year effort to accommodate the needs of the diverse groups visiting Punchbowl and the residents of its surrounding community.

Tour prices are \$15 for adults and free for children under 12 years of age. The proceeds from the tour will be used to fund American Legion programs that help youths, veterans and their families. Specific programs include Junior Baseball, and oratorical contests, Boy Scouts of America, veterans assistance and rehabilitation.

"I tried for three years to get funding for our service division to no avail," said Henry Lamb, adjutant of the American Legion, adding that the Legion is hoping to hire full-time service personnel to help veterans file benefit claims.
