- The Guard Recruiting Assistance Program (GRAP). Being a retired Guardmember, you now can register to become involved with the Guard Recruiting Assistance Program (GRAP). Below is more information on the program you can go on line to register and get more information. It could be a good way to supplement your retirement income and continue to serve the Army or Air National Guard.

To maintain today's readiness and strength requirements while preparing for tomorrow's challenges, the Guard Recruiting Assistance Program promotes strength from within by recognizing and rewarding those who help the National Guard achieve its goals. National Guard Recruiting Assistants are embedded in their respective communities and are uniquely positioned to identify Potential Airmen in the people they already know. It's the effective way to promote strength from within.

There are different programs for Army and Air Guard recruiting assistants (RA). But basically, each RA will cultivate quality potential enlistees from within their individual spheres of influence. Once a potential enlistee is identified and pre-qualified, the RA will facilitate a meeting engagement with their local recruiter. The triad of recruiter, RA, and potential enlistee will then work closely to process the potential enlistee and move them toward their enlistment.

National Guard Recruiting Assistants can earn additional income assisting recruiting efforts by identifying well-qualified men and women for service in the National Guard. Upon verified enlistment, the RA will receive an initial payment of \$1,000, with a second \$1,000 payment upon verification of the recruit's successful shipment to Basic Training. There is another program for each prior service member who completes a 90-day affiliation with the unit.

Qualify to become a National Guard Recruiting Assistant through a simple online process. Take the first step toward earning additional income while assisting the National Guard in meeting future manpower requirements.

The Guard Recruiting Assistance Program (GRAP) is a contracted program designed for individuals who voluntarily apply online to become eligible to serve as a recruiting assistant

- (RA). This program is administered by Docupak, Inc. of Alabaster, Alabama. The RA applicant will be verified and hired by a contractor, not the National Guard.
- 2008 NMFA Military Spouse Scholarship Program. Thanks to a new partnership between the National Military Family Association (NMFA) and Fisher House Foundation, the NMFA Joanne Holbrook Patton Military Spouse Scholarship Program will be able to assist many more deserving spouses. NMFA's Joanne Holbrook Patton Military Spouse Scholarships are awarded to military spouses to obtain professional certification or to attend post secondary or graduate school. Scholarships normally range from \$500 to \$1,000 and may be used for tuition, fees, and school room and board. Spouses of uniformed service members (active duty, National Guard and Reserve, retirees, and survivors) of any branch or rank are eligible to apply. Applications are accepted online January 15 through March 15, 2008. - Commissary Scholarship Applications Available. Applications for the Defense Commissary Agency's 2008 Scholarships for Military Children are now available in commissaries worldwide. The \$1,500 scholarships are for children of active-duty and retired military, as well as children of Guard and reserve Soldiers. Applicants must plan to attend an accredited college or university full time in the fall of 2008. The deadline to apply is 20 February 2008. At least one scholarship will be awarded at every commissary location with qualified candidates. - <u>VA Home Loan Rules Change</u>. In the past, qualified veterans and active duty Soldiers have been able to obtain loans without down payments, but the loan size has been strictly limited. Now, with a down payment of at least 25 percent of the loan amount above the current limit (\$417,000), the Government National Mortgage Association (Ginnie Mae) will permit larger loans.
