## 2. Business.

- Congratulations to the Hawaii Army National Guard's new Command Sergeant Majors. They are: Robert Ednilao, Virgine Kanoa, and Robert Zavala. The national selection board reviews the records of many sergeant majors and only a few of these solders become command sergeant majors. Their selection is a major achievement in each of their careers!
- Congratulations to SrA Sue Musrasrik-Quiles, of the 154<sup>th</sup> Wing Comptroller Office, who became a naturalized American citizen on January 14, 2008. She took advantage of a special program that expedites the naturalization progress and waives all fees (several hundred dollars). To qualify, you have honorably served in the AOR. SPC Mabel Requilman, of the Human Resources Office, took advantage of this program last year. Congratulations again to both new citizens!
- <u>A First!</u> Belated Congratulations to the **154<sup>th</sup> Medical Group**, who received an Outstanding in their Health Services Inspection (HSI) in January. The Air Force Inspector General Team conducted an extensive inspection and the results reflect the leadership and hard work by all medical group members. Super Job by the commander, **Lt Col Stanley Sato** and his unit!
- The Air Force awarded the **Headquarters**, **Hawaii Air National Guard**, the Air Force Organizational Excellence Award (AFOEA). The period of service for the award is July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2007. This award is the "outstanding unit award" for unnumbered Air Force organizations. I believe this is the second AFOEA that HQ HIANG has received. Congratulations to **Maj Gen Darryll Wong** and the members of the Headquarters!
- The Air Force awarded the 15<sup>th</sup> Airlift Wing the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award (AFOUA). The period of service for the award is November 1, 2006 to October 31, 2007. The 154<sup>th</sup> Maintenance Group was included in the award as part of Team Hickam. Congratulations to all!
- Another Guard Benefit Coming. This year's legislature passed HB 2605 and as we go to press, the bill is awaiting Governor Lingle's signature. It was a long and hard fight to get the bill through, with a lot of support from the officer and enlisted associations and individual Guardmembers; it passed during the last days of the session. HB 2605 provides for the exemption of vehicle weight taxes for one noncommercial vehicle per member of the National Guard or Reserve members. Unfortunately, it does not apply to retirees but it is a great new benefit for Guardmembers in these tough financial times. It will serve as a great recruiting tool. Mahalo to everyone who worked to get this bill through the legislature!
- <u>Not Law Yet!</u> The United States Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources approved legislation that would allow veterans to purchase a special, discount pass to see America's national parks. The Veterans Eagle Parks Pass Act (S.617) would establish a new \$10 "Eagle Pass" that would allow former servicemembers to visit all national parks for a full

year. The committee amended the bill to also allow active duty, Guard and Reserve members to be eligible for the pass. The bill still has a few more hurdles before it will reach the President for signature.

• <u>Pearl Harbor Historic Sites FREE to Military Personnel, Families this Memorial Day.</u> The Pearl Harbor Historic Sites partners are proud to offer complimentary general admission to all active-duty, reserve and retired U.S. military personnel and their dependants on Memorial Day, May 26, 2008. Qualified visitors must present a valid military I.D. upon entering the historic site or sites of their choice.

Applicable historic sites include the USS Bowfin Submarine Museum and Park, Battleship Missouri Memorial and Pacific Aviation Museum - Pearl Harbor. The USS Arizona Memorial and recently dedicated USS Oklahoma Memorial, both operated and maintained by the National Parks Service, already offer free daily admission.

The Pearl Harbor Historic Sites provide a powerful historical journey unlike any other, an experience that has matured and grown far beyond that of a mere single day. These memorials and museums carry forth the legacies of several of our nation's most treasured icons, are enduring tributes to the valor and sacrifices of our veterans, and provide windows into a past era when the future of our nation and the world truly hung in the balance.

Memorial Day, traditionally observed on the last Monday of May, commemorates all fallen U.S. men and women who gave their lives in military service to their country. Its origins began as a tribute to Union soldiers during the American Civil War. Following the First World War, the observance was expanded to include those who died in any war or military action.

- TRICARE Goes Digital. TRICARE for Life (TFL) beneficiaries will soon be able to print a copy of their Explanation of Benefits (EOB) from the convenience of their own homes. Starting this month, the only paper EOB's that TFL beneficiaries living in the United States and U.S. territories will receive will be monthly summaries. In February, beneficiaries will have the option to receive an electronic notification every time a claim processes by logging on to the secure website at <a href="http://www.TRICARE4U.com">http://www.TRICARE4U.com</a> to view and print their EOB. For more information about the registration process, beneficiaries can call toll-free at 1-866-773-0404 or at the Telecommunications Device for the Deaf (TDD) telephone number 1-866-773-0405.
- TRICARE to Cover Lap-Band Procedure. TRICARE beneficiaries whose weight poses a serious health risk now have a new surgical alternative available. For those who medically qualify, TRICARE now covers laparoscopic adjustable gastric banding, also commonly called Lap-Band surgery. Although TRICARE just made the policy change, coverage is retroactive to February 1, 2007. - <u>Commissaries Offer Online Dietician</u>. The Defense Commissary Agency's (DeCA) dietitian is available to help the retiree community lose weight, get in shape, and maintain good health. Maj. Karen Fauber offers a weekly online column, "The Dietitian's Voice," and a discussion forum, "Ask the DeCA Dietitian" on the <u>DeCA website</u>. Just click on the "Healthy Living" tab in the top navigation bar to find the link to the DeCA Dietitian page. Visitors to the site will find

suggestions for eating healthy, such as a variety of nutrition tips and meal choices. People can also submit questions to the major, and participate in an online forum to discuss healthy eating and shopping ideas.

- The Air Force Will Stop Issuing Car Decals. In keeping with Air Force directives, the 154th Security Forces Squadron will no longer issue installation vehicle decals as of July 9, 2008. The squadron currently has a limited supply of decals that they will continue to issue until they are exhausted. If you have the need to enter any other military installation Pearl Harbor, Schofield or Marine Corps Base Hawaii the squadron recommend you register your vehicles with that installation since this is an Air Force policy only. Otherwise, if you don't have a decal, you will have to get a visitors pass. Other DoD branches will continue to issue decals.
- Beginning November 10, 2007, Air Force Basic Military Training (BMT) will increase from six to eight weeks. The additional two weeks will include field and combat training to reflect the current world situation.

WASHINGTON - U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye is pleased to announce the appointment of retired Air Force Colonel Walter Kaneakua as his new Honolulu-based Executive Assistant for Military Affairs.

Kaneakua, an Air Force command pilot, retired after 27 years of active duty service with both the U.S. Air Force and the Hawaii Air National Guard. He commanded the 9th Airborne Command and Control Squadron and the start-up 203rd Air Refueling KC-135 Squadron. His last assignment was as Vice Wing Commander for the 154th Wing at Hickam Air Force Base. Most recently, Kaneakua flew as a Captain for Aloha Airlines.

Kaneakua replaces retired Army Major General Alexis Lum, who faithfully served as the Senator's Executive Assistant for Military Affairs from 1991 to 2007, when he retired to spend more time with his family. Prior to his service with Senator Inouye, Lum served as the Adjutant General for the State of Hawaii. He retired from that position in 1991 with

more than 43 years of decorated service to the U.S. Army and the Hawaii National Guard.
