• <u>Anheuser-Busch Offers Free Theme-Park Entry</u>. For the rest of this year, sitting in Shamu the killer whale's "splash zone" or talking turkey with a big yellow bird are just two activities military members and their families can enjoy free at Anheuser-Busch Adventure Parks. Through its "Here's to the Heroes" program, which began in 2005, the brewing company is offering free tickets to its theme parks for all currently serving personnel - Active, Guard and Reserve - and up to three family members to thank them for all they do in service to the country.

"It's important to us for all the reasons you can probably predict," said Fred Jacobs, vice president of communications for Anheuser-Busch. "[This] is a great way for them to reconnect, particularly if they've been separated."

The only requirement is to fill out a form, which is available online at www.herosalute.com or at the park. Every person over 10 years old must also present a valid military identification. Each pass is valid for a one-day admission per person per year to five of Anheuser-Busch's seven theme park brands.

Visitors may choose Sea World Orlando, San Diego or San Antonio; Busch Gardens Tampa Bay or Williamsburg; Pennsylvania's Sesame Place; Florida's Adventure Island; or Virginia's Water Country USA. • <u>Social Security Military Adjustment</u>. **CMSgt Denise Jelinskihall**, the Hawaii National Guard Senior Enlisted Advisor, forwarded this information to me earlier. I believe she got it from **Maj Aaron "Cujo" Keenan**, 199th Fighter Squadron.

The Social Security Administration (SSA) allows extra money [sic] to military members who served between 1940 and 2001. When you apply for your SSA, you need to have ALL of your DD-214's. Reserve members are authorized this benefit. They, too, need all DD-214's at the ready. By pre-planning, you have time to gather your forms, and if you are missing one, you have time to get the forms and put them away for future use. For more details, go to http://www.ssa.gov.

• When a retiree dies, the surviving spouse, or children are often unsure about what they should do in regard to the military retiree's pay and benefits. A retiree should create a list of names and phone numbers that need to be contacted when he or she dies and inform the

spouse and family members as to what is on the list and where to find it. This list should include the:

- DFAS, Retired and Annuity Pay Center 1-800-321-1080 to stop retired pay, apply for Survivor Benefits, and obtain information about insurance and other allotments
- Veterans Administration 1-800-827-1000 for Disability Pay and burial assistance and/or applying for Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DICE) for the surviving spouse
- Social Security Administration 1-800-772-1213 to discuss Social Security Survivor benefits
- Office of Personnel Management 1-888-767-6738 for retirees who are receiving civil service pensions in addition to military retired pay

- <u>Pre-planning Your Funeral</u>. Pre-planning and pre-paying for funeral and burial can make the grieving process easier for surviving family members. The <u>USAA Educational Foundation</u> provides two booklets that prepare families for the death of a loved one, "<u>A Guide for Your Survivors</u>" and "<u>When a Loved One Dies -- Legal and Financial Concerns</u>," also provides forms on their website that allows the user to enter the information needed in pre-planning a funeral. Funeral directors may also provide booklets such as a "<u>Personal Arrangement Guide</u>" or similar guides where you can list all of this information.
