2. Business.

- <u>Bush signs new military tax breaks into law</u>. President Bush signed a military tax bill containing a combination of new tax benefits and the extension of existing benefits into law Tuesday. The Heroes Earnings Assistance and Relief Tax Act of 2008, or HEART Act, includes a provision allowing military families to receive the \$600-per-person economic stimulus rebate even if a spouse does not have a Social Security number. Also, through the law:
- Survivors of people who die on active-duty are now allowed to put all or part of death gratuity payments into a tax-deferred savings or retirement plan, even if this puts them over the annual limit for contributions.
- Mobilized National Guard and reserve members may make penalty-free withdrawals from their personal retirement plan, which especially helps those with financial troubles caused by military service.
- Guard and reserve members who contribute to an employer-provided flexible spending account can get refunds of contributions at the end of a calendar year, rather than lose the money, if they have been mobilized, since mobilizations could interfere with their ability to spend money as expected.
- Small businesses employing Guard and reserve members may receive a \$4,000 tax credit to make up salary differences for employees who are mobilized for military duty.
- When calculating aid for military families, the Social Security Administration will not use combat-related pays to disqualify a family for disability or health benefits.
- <u>Rules of Engagement (ROE)</u>. Periodically, someone e-mails me requesting the e-mail address of another retiree. I forward the e-mail with the request to the retiree for their action. This preserves the privacy of the retiree and their e-mail address.
