• The Secretary of Defense, Robert M. Gates has nominated Lieutenant General Craig McKinley as The Chief, National Guard Bureau. The effect date will be set after the Senate confirms the nomination. Lt Gen McKinley currently serves as The Director, Air National Guard, starting in the director's position in May 2006. Lieutenant General H Steven Blum, the current Chief, National Guard Bureau has released the following statement: "Today, the Secretary of Defense announced that Lieutenant General Craig McKinley is the nominee to be Chief, National Guard Bureau and elevated to the rank of General. Craig has and will continue to have my complete confidence and full support. I am committed to making the transition period entirely professional and collaborative. • <u>The State of Hawai'i Unclaimed Property Program</u> collects and holds, in a custodial capacity, abandoned property from holders (companies, states, state agencies, etc.). As a public service, the state also returns the property to the rightful owners at no charge.

Abandoned property commonly includes dormant (no activity for 5 years) checking and savings accounts, uncashed checks, stock certificates, and contents of safe deposit boxes. This program is administered under the provisions of Chapter 523A, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

• <u>Hickam AFB Main Gate Construction</u>. Construction for bollard installation will begin at the Main gate 21 July 2008 around 0900.
