2. Business.

• Lt Col Randy Tom forwarded these comments from Col Joseph Lengyel, Commander, Air National Guard Readiness Center, announcing the passing of a legendary Guardmember.

On behalf of Lt Gen McKinley, it is with profound sadness that I inform you of the passing of **Chief Master Sergeant Paul Lankford**. He passed away on August 22, 2008 at the age of 89. As you all know, Retired Chief Master Sergeant Paul Lankford was a survivor of the Bataan Death March and spent 42 months as a prisoner of war during World War II in the Philippines in 1942. After his ordeal, Chief Lankford continued his service to our country and retired in 1981 with 40 years of service. He served as the first enlisted commandant of the Professional Military Education Center at McGhee Tyson ANGB and has been inducted into the U.S. AF Enlisted Heritage Hall Museum.

I think Lt Gen John Conaway (former Chief, National Guard Bureau) said it best when he stated, "Chief Lankford was a great American, legend, WWII hero, Guardsman, and friend to all who knew him - someone who epitomized the greatest generation in our nation's history. We were extremely fortunate to have him attend and speak at Business and Industry Day in May, and he will certainly be missed."

Lt Col Tom added his comments about Chief Lankford's passing.

Some of you retirees may have attended courses at McGhee-Tyson ANGB, Tennessee during your career. The former enlisted NCO Academy dorm was named for him. In Lankford Hall, every state and territory had a special room that was decorated and maintained by its graduates. I got to view the rooms; they were spectacular and really represented the best of each state and territory. Although I never met the Chief, I am thoroughly convinced that everyone who crossed paths with him had high praise for him.

• CMSgt Denise Jelinski Hall sent the following link to the Hawaii National Guard Enlisted Association (HNGEA) - http://www.hngea.net/. The site is still new and construction continues. The HNGEA continues to work for more benefits for Hawaii Guard members. Membership is open to retirees and applications are online at this site.

During this year's legislative session, the HNGEA worked with the Hawaii National Guard Association (the local National Guard officers association) to support House Bill 2605. The bill eventually passed and Governor Lingle signed it into law. Effective October 1, 2008, it provides for the exemption of the vehicle weight taxes for one noncommercial vehicle per member of the National Guard or Reserves. This exemption does not apply to retirees but is another excellent recruiting tool and benefit for current members.

• <u>Information for Tricare Beneficiaries Available by E-mail</u>. The Tricare military health system's 9.2 million beneficiaries now have an easy way to receive the latest newsletters and stay informed about changes in coverage, pharmacy updates, and other news.

A new electronic delivery system is up and running. Tricare officials said subscribing is fast and secure by clicking on the "little red envelope" on Tricare's Web site, www.tricare.mil.

"We're excited to offer beneficiaries a chance to sign up for the Tricare benefit news they want and need," said Army Maj. Gen. Elder Granger, deputy director of Tricare Management Activity. "We have offered some limited e-mail delivery options in the past, but this new subscription service enables anyone interested in Tricare news to sign up for a wide range of topics. It's one-stop shopping."

Subscribers can choose alerts by topics or beneficiary category. Delivery is safe and secure. An e-mail address is the only information collected. Subscribers also have a unique page they can manage any time and they can choose to be notified as soon as news or benefit changes are posted or get updates daily, weekly, or monthly.

The new subscription service also links users to similar alerts available on other Military Health System (MHS) Web sites, including www.health.mil, which features MHS news and other information.

"One of our highest priorities is communicating with our beneficiaries and providers," Granger said. "E-mail is now the method most people use to receive news and that will only continue to increase. This new service helps us take advantage of the technology."

Partnership subscription options with other health-related Federal Web sites include the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Disabilityinfo.gov.

- <u>Speed Limit Change on Hickam AFB</u>. On September 2, 2008, the speed limit in both directions on O'Malley Blvd between the overpass and Apollo Avenue will be decreased to 30 MPH from the existing 35 MPH. This change is being implemented in an effort to enhance overall traffic safety. All motorists please note that the speed limit on either side of this area will remain at 25 MPH. - <u>National POW/MIA Recognition Day</u>. The United States traditionally observes National POW/MIA Recognition Day on the third Friday of September. However, this year, the commemoration day will be on September 19, 2008. The theme for 2008 commemorates the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific.

Federal law allows the flying the black POW/MIA flag over federal facilities and cemeteries, post offices and military installations on that day. For more information, visit the <u>Defense Prisoner of War/Missing Personnel Office</u> website.

• New Static Displays at the Pacific Aviation Museum on Ford Island. If you didn't see or read the press coverage, there was a transfer of one of the Hawaii Air National Guard's F-15A Eagles to the Pacific Aviation Museum on Ford Island.

Originally headed for the aircraft boneyard at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base in Arizona, the Eagle, tail number 76-0063, is how part of the Pacific Aviation Museum. Museum President

Clint Churchill, who retired as the Commander, Hawaii Air National Guard, spearheaded the transfer efforts. The Hawaii Air National Guard's other historic fighter aircraft; the F-86E Sabre. F-102A Delta Dagger and F-4C Phantom II, will eventually become part of the museum.

The nonprofit aviation museum currently operates out of Hangar 37 on Ford Island. Pearl Harbor. The museum's ongoing fundraising goal is to raise \$83 million over and above the \$17 million already raised to continue the museum's expansion. The money raised will renovate and open hangars 79 and 54 with full displays and for the restoration of the iconic red-and-whitestriped control tower.
