2. Business.

- <u>Policy Change for Replacing ID Cards</u>. Homeland Security Directive 12 now requires retirees and family members seeking to renew or replace a military identification card to provide two types of ID. Retirees and family members needing identification cards must have two of the following types of current identification -- one of which must include a photo:
- -- Driver's license or ID issued by a state or outlying U.S. commonwealth or possession
- -- ID card issued by federal, state, or local government agencies or entities
- -- School ID card with a photograph
- -- Voter's registration card
- -- U.S. military ID card
- -- U.S. passport
- -- Certificate of U.S. citizenship
- -- Certificate of naturalization

For persons younger than 18, who are unable to present a document previously listed, they may bring:

- -- School record or report card
- -- Clinic, doctor, or hospital record
- -- Day-care or nursery school record

The listing above is not all-inclusive. A list of acceptable documents can be found at www.uscis.gov/files/form/l-9.pdf, page 4.

Before visiting a military ID card issuing facility, people may want to call first to determine what specific documents may be required, and to verify the process to renew or replace an ID card. For contact information and the location of the nearest ID card issuing facility, visit http://www.dmdc.osd.mil/rsl/owa/home. On this website, people can search by city, state, or ZIP code.

• During the month of September, our Family Readiness Group, led by LTC Laura Wheeler and Mrs. Joanne Yamamoto, conducted two marriage enrichment workshops. The first workshop was at the Turtle Bay Resort for couples on Oahu. The second was at the Sheraton Keauhou Bay for Big Island couples.

Earlier in the month, several Family Readiness Group personnel attended the Joint Family Support Assistance Program Training in Washington, D.C. The Family Readiness Group and their volunteers continue to do an outstanding job support our deployed members.

• <u>Air Force BMT expands from six weeks to 8½ weeks</u>. A new field training site for the soon-to-be-expanded Basic Military Training course at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, is about 80

percent complete and will be finished in the coming weeks, according to the commander who oversees BMT.

The site - called the Basic Expeditionary Airman Skills Training, or BEAST, facility - is designed to simulate a forward operating base to which airmen might deploy in the Middle East, said Col. Edward Westermann, 737th Training Group commander. Starting with the class that enters BMT on Nov. 3, each class will spend five days at the BEAST during its sixth week of training, learning expeditionary skills and living in the field.

The BEAST site consists of four zones with 10 tents each. Each zone will be self-contained and operate as a mini-FOB, Westermann said. "I think this is as realistic ... as we can get here at BMT," he said. The site also has a 1½-mile improvised explosive device trail so airmen can practice spotting roadside bombs and an airstrip the airmen will learn to secure. Airmen will also learn to respond to simulated air and ground attacks.

BMT expands from six weeks to 8½ weeks with the class beginning Nov. 3, but the first group of more than 800 students will not arrive at the BEAST course until December 15.

• New Security Measures at the 154th Wing compound on Hickam AFB. There are new procedures for all the gates into the 154th Wing compound that started in September. These new procedures are stepped up Air Force requirements to protect our personnel and resources as the 154th Wing transitions to the F-22 Raptor. These changes made are in conjunction with the 15th Airlift Wing Installation Security Council, who has the overall responsibility of the security of Hickam AFB.

These two gates will be closed, but remain unlocked during normal operating hours.

- Gate 13, commonly known as the "pilot's" gate.
- Gate 15, commonly known as the "LRS" gate.

These four gates remain closed and locked. Guard personnel who are authorized to be unescorted in the compound will have the gate combination(s). Personnel using the gate must insure that they lock the gates behind.

- Gate 10, the vehicular gate into the motor pool/AGE building area.
- Gate 14, the pedestrian gate into the F-15 hanger area from the oceanside parking lot.
- Gate 16, the pedestrian gate into the area between the supply and engine shop buildings
- Gate 17, the vehicular gate onto the F-15 flightline from the avionics building.
- A sore point for many is the Exchange System's requirement to write in your social security number when you pay by check. This requirement remains in a time where everyone is concerned about the compromise of your social security number to identity theft. To increase the opportunity for a compromise, the Exchange System asks for a card or document that shows your social security number.

The following is an editorial that appeared in the **Army Times** newspaper in August.

The Defense Department is in the midst of a multiyear effort to eliminate full Social Security numbers from ID cards. The new Common Access Card issued to service members does not include SSNs. ID cards for family members and retirees will also drop SSNs, or at least all but the last four digits, within a few years. Many states (*Hawaii included*) no longer use SSNs for driver's license numbers.

The reason is simple: In the digital age, a Social Security number is all a savvy thief needs to steal someone's identity and ruin his credit rating.

"Today, all of our [computer] systems can 'talk' to each other, so we don't necessarily need to know all of that information printed on your card," Mary Dixon, the Defense Department's Common Access Card program manager, said in April.

Not quite all systems. The Army and Air Force Exchange Service and Navy Exchange Service Command still require patrons paying by check to produce a document showing their SSN. AAFES even requires an SSN to process a refund on a returned item.

That means that even as SSNs vanish from ID cards, the exchanges are forcing patrons to physically possess some other crucial document, such as a Social Security card or a passport, in order to write a check or get a refund at the stores. The AAFES and NEXCOM policies are defeating the Defense Department's efforts to get Social Security numbers out of public view. No commercial retailer would require customers to verify Social Security numbers. No military exchange should, either.

- <u>Rules of Engagement (ROE)</u>. Periodically, someone e-mails me requesting the e-mail address of another retiree. I forward the e-mail with the address request to the retiree for their action. This preserves the privacy of the retiree and their e-mail address.
