• <u>Air Force implements a new "No Guest Policy" at the Hickam AFB Commissary</u>. Effective May 1, 2009, authorized commissary patrons will no longer be permitted to sponsor guests into the Hickam AFB commissary. This new policy parallels the policy instituted by the Navy at the Navy commissary in December 2008.

This policy is to protect the authorized patron's commissary benefit. It is the responsibility of the all authorized patrons to ensure compliance of the instruction. Failure to do so can result in loss of their privileges. Authorized commissary patrons are reminded that all dependent children 10 years old and older are required to have a valid ID card in their possession when accompanying their parents into the commissary.

A little-known veterans' benefit for long-term care expenses is available to wartime veterans and their spouses. But the benefit is being overlooked by thousands of families.

The Special Pension for Veterans' Aid and Attendance pays up to \$1,644 a month, \$19,736 annually, toward assisted living, nursing homes or in-home care for veterans 65 and older who served at least 90 days and one day during wartime — stateside or overseas. Veterans and their spouses can receive up to \$23,396 annually and spouses of deceased veterans, \$12,681.

• Removal of Social Security Numbers (SSNs) from DoD ID Cards. SSNs will no longer be printed on cards and should not be relied on as a unique ID number. These changes are being made by the Department to protect the identity information of cardholders. Changes to ID cards will occur when the cardholders' expired cards are renewed. The removal of SSNs will occur in three phases, all of which will occur upon ID card renewal.

Removal will occur in three phases and changes to cards will be made upon ID card renewal.

- Phase One: Remove Dependent SSNs: To begin by end of calendar year 2008
- Phase Two: Remove printed SSNs from all cards: To begin by end of calendar year 2009

- Phase Three: Remove SSNs embedded in barcodes: To begin during calendar year 2012

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

- Who Does This Affect? All DoD ID cardholders.
- Should I Go Now? No, go when you need to renew your card. If you are a retiree with an indefinite expiration date and wish to replace your card with one without an SSN, the earliest you may do so is January 2010.
- Where Should I Go? Visit the RAPIDS Site Locator: www.dmdc.osd.mil/rsl/owa/home to find a location near you. Updated CAC cards and Teslin (paper) cards will be issued at over 1,500 RAPIDS ID card centers worldwide.
- What Should I Bring? Two forms of ID from the OMB I-9 document list. One must be a federal or state issued photo ID. Visit www.formi9.com for more information.
- <u>Air Guard Web Site Honors Hometown Heroes</u>. A new Air National Guard recognition program that will honor thousands of citizen-airmen for their service launched a Web site April 1. Getting on-line information about the Hometown Heroes Salute campaign to its units was the Air Guard's next step in recognizing 80,000 airmen who have deployed since Sept. 11, 2001. The Web site https://airguard.ang.af.mil/hometownheroessalute provides ordering information, criteria and other Hometown Heroes Salute campaign content and contacts. It also provides background and briefings on the campaign, which has been described as the largest recognition endeavor in Air Guard history.

In cooperation with the states, it will recognize airmen who deployed for more than 30 consecutive days for Operations Noble Eagle, Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom, as well as other contingency operations. The Web site helps the states initiate the awards process, said Linda Brooks, the campaign's program manager.

The campaign will first recognize every eligible airman who has deployed since 9/11. They will receive a cherry wood encased letter of appreciation signed by General Craig R. McKinley, the former Air Guard director who is now Chief of the National Guard Bureau, and Chief Master Sergeant Richard Smith, the Air Guard's command chief.

A three-tier recognition system will start in 2010 that will award other items for further deployments and longer deployments. The first awards ceremony should be held next month. "There are probably about 60 units that we are processing now," Brooks said. "The Web site is their tool to request these awards from a nationwide campaign that recognizes our airmen for their service and what they continue to do for their nation, states and communities."
